

91. New W.R. Case & Sons Tested XX Stainless Solingen Germany. Nice Celluloid tortoise handles, etching on blade inside jimbs. Box.



92. "Griffon" XX, made in Germany; Griffon Cutlery Works. An old and Very Sharp blade, with Carbo Magnetic etched. Old Horn handles, inside jimping and "60" on tang. Also there are initials MB on the tail. A good shaver. Comes with old box unreadable.



93. Rare Waterville Cutlery razor. Waterville, Conn from 1865-1890. It is set in younger celluloid slick-black handles one of which has small chip near the pivot. The blade is in good condition and only trace rust on the inside jimps. Shaveable.



94. Edmund Roffler, made in France. Small spot rust. Collectible. Metal inlaid Logo in handle, top/bottom jimps.



95. "DE-FI" from Wester Bros., Solingen, Germany. This razor has beautiful celluloid handles and is in very good condition; only a TOR near the pivot. Shaveable.



96. "NUBAK" from Genco, Geneva, NY. \$3.00 on right tang. The blade is in good and sharp condition. Shaveable. Made from 1902-1935. The handles are beautiful. Only a small chip near the pivot.



97. FELTON'S CRYSTAL in clear Celluloid handles. Made in Germany for Geo. Felton, Cutler, Scranton, PA. TOR near the pivot. Old but Sharp.



98. Groghan Cutlery Co. Fremont, OH. Black celluloid handles. In Good condition and Sharp Shaver. No problems.



99. Absolutely beautiful handles, perhaps the nicest I've ever seen. ERIK ANTON BERG, Sweden. Eskil Tuna with fish logo on tang. No rust. Shaveable.





100. ARCHER CUPID. Cupid on the left tang. Archer Mfg. Co. New York on the right. Set in beautiful ivory style celluloid handles with double bolsters at both ends. No rust, Shiny Sharp Shaver

102. "BARBER'S FRIEND" etched on blade, with 61 W.H. MORLEY CLOVER BRAND, Germany on the tang. Tang is stamp scrolled with inside jimping. Gorgeous Celluloid Elk in Forest handles. No Rust. Very Good condition. Box. Pre-1927



103. Pair of Joseph Rogers in Box. Both are 7/8 and set in black celluloid handles. There is some rust near the back of one, but are otherwise in very good condition.

108. A "22 TENNIS" from FRITZ BRACHT, Solingen, Germany, with Tennis metal inlay on Celluloid handles. Good condition. Etched blade.



109. Very Colorful Cracked Ice Celluloid handles holding a 3/8 Ex-Sel blade made by W.R. CASE & SONS, Bradford, PA. Small repaired break on handle right of Ex-Sel logo.



110. Butcher. Sheffield. Old Horn Handles. Blade is worn but very sharp and in great condition for its 1820-30 age from W. Butcher although “& Sons” continued then till 1942. But I think it’s the earlier because of the horn.
